Cadder Church



Auld Kirk Museum


The Auld Kirk and its graveyard, 380 years old this year, form one of the finest and oldest sites in Kirkintilloch. The building features an 18th century pulpit and a 1663 Gerhard Koster bell, which is now part of the museum collection. In the churchyard, tombstones have been laid flat or propped against the boundary walls.

The museum within the building showcases objects primarily related to the social and industrial history of East Dunbartonshire, along with hosting temporary exhibitions. Permanent exhibits include objects spanning from the Neolithic era to Roman times, and from the industrial past to the 20th century. During Doors Open Day this year, the popular Annual Art Exhibition will be on show at the museum along with a small display of gadgets from the collection and everyday items from days gone by.

St Mary's Parish Church

The striking pink sandstone neo-gothic church was built in 1914 to replace the old church which is now the Auld Kirk Museum. The building features excellent stained-glass windows and wood carvings designed by local artists.

William Patrick Library: Display by Kirkintilloch and District Society of Antiquaries

The William Patrick Library opened at its current location in 1994 to replace the town library at Camphill House, Peel Park. It was refurbished in 2012. The stained-glass panels from Middlecroft House, the former home of Rita Cowan Taketsuru, the mother of Japanese Whisky, are housed inside. Visit Archives and Local Studies on the first floor of the library during its opening hours to discover more about your local history.

The Antiquaries are hosting an exhibition in the foyer of the library on the theme of "Significant Personalities of Kirkintilloch and District" with a new group of personalities. The exhibition will include archive and newly taken photographs of significant residents of the district, their houses, workplaces, other sites associated with them, and their graves and memorials in the Old Aisle Cemetery. Come along on Saturday 6 September between 10am and 4pm to chat to members of the Antiquaries. The exhibition will then continue until Saturday 13 September.



Lennoxtown Library


Display by Campsie Local History Group

Campsie Cemetery in Lennoxtown



Clober Farm

Clober Farm was originally an 18th century farmhouse which was split into 3 dwellings. One of which was bequeathed to Spinal Injuries Scotland. Extensive renovations carried out in 2012 created a beautiful, tranquil holiday apartment adapted to allow easy access and living for those with a spinal injury or mobility issues. Specialised features and equipment throughout make this property a wonderful example of adapted living at its best enabling quests to enjoy a stress-free break.

You will be given an informative tour of the apartment's features which make it such a special place for those with mobility problems to have a holiday. We will also cover the rich history of the house and the story behind the changes the house has gone through.

Gavin's Mill

Gavin's Mill is one of the oldest buildings in Milngavie, dating from at least the 16th century. Powered by the Allander Water, it operated as a grain mill and latterly as a sawmill until about 1960 when a fire gutted the interior. It was bought and reconstructed by architect Bert Morris and functioned as an office and restaurant until 2014. In 2017 the Gavin's Mill community project took it over and opened as a fair-trade shop and café.

Enjoy guided tours, an exhibition of photos and artefacts, a demonstration of milling with quern stones, and a Memories Corner. The waterwheel will be running at intervals throughout the day.

Gavin's Mill is open from 10am – 4pm on Saturday 6 September.

Lillie Art Gallery:Guided tour of the Gallery Store

The Lillie Art Gallery is a purpose-built gallery opened in 1962. It owes its existence to local banker and artist Robert Lillie (1867-1949), who left a substantial number of his own artworks as well as funds to build the gallery.

Since 1962, this founding bequest of artworks has been developed to form a collection of Scottish art dating from the 1880s to the present day. Around 450 works are contained in the collection, which includes paintings, prints, drawings and a small collection of sculpture and ceramics.

Enjoy a peek behind the scenes in the store of the Lillie Art Gallery. Tours are at 2.15pm and 3.15pm and will last approximately 30 minutes. Booking is essential, please phone the gallery to book on 0141 956 5536.

Milngavie Library: Display by Milngavie Heritage Centre Group

Held within the Milngavie Library, The Milngavie Heritage Centre group's next heritage exhibition explores the fascinating history of Mains Estate and its connection to the Douglas Family. The "Douglas" name is very familiar in Milngavie; think of Douglas Academy, Douglas Street and Douglas House (formerly the local cinema). The name derives from one of the oldest landowning families in the Milngavie area. Their old estate of Mains has been largely developed for modern housing in a semi-rural setting. It also an opportunity to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of Mains Estate Residents Association, which was founded in 1975.

Caldwell Halls

Caldwell Halls, once the village school for Torrance, has a rich history that begins with its two-storey section, built in 1813. The upper floor served as the residence for the schoolmaster and was accessible via a staircase at the rear of the building. Classes were conducted on the ground floor, which is now the foyer.

Join us for an engaging event featuring displays that celebrate the village school, complemented by a Handling Kit provided by EDLC. Attendees will have the chance to explore the history of school life over the years, including opportunities to try out traditional children's games. Cycling has long been popular in Torrance and the wider Campsie area, making it a favoured resting spot for cyclists from urban locations.

In celebration of their centenary, Nightingales Cycle Club, alongside the Ivy Cycle Club, will showcase a captivating exhibition of bikes and cycling artifacts for enthusiasts to enjoy. Additionally, we will feature heritage displays and a visual archive exhibition focused on the history of Torrance and Baldernock. This event is a wonderful opportunity for all ages to drop in, explore, and connect with the community. Tea and coffee will be provided for your enjoyment. We look forward to welcoming you!


