

# The Long Road Back to Achill

**Léadh Aifreann na Marbh** ar 10.30 r.n. ar an Satharn 18 Meán Fómhair i gKirkintilloch. I dtús baile bhí sé i gceist na coirp a chur sa tseanreilig i gKirkintilloch ach tháinig athair ar an phlean nuair a fuarthas sreangscéal ó Eirinn leis na focail seo scríofa air, 'Beir Abhaile ár Marbh'.

I ndiaidh an Aifreinn thosaigh na mairbh ar an turas fada go hAcla agus daoine muinteartha leo ag siúl ar a gcúl a fhad le teorann Kirkintilloch. Cuireadh busanna speisialta ar fáil lena dtabhairt go Glaschú. Is iomaí deoir a síleadh agus deich gcónra ag dul ar bord long Burns & Laird, Lairdsburn, agus leagadh amach ar an deic uachtair iad.

I ndiaidh turais thar oíche tháinig an long i dtír i mBaile Átha Cliath agus sheol go mall suas An Life agus tuairim is 6,000 duine ag amharc ón ché. Cuireadh na cónair ar bord traenach ansin sna carráistí ar cúl agus d'imigh siar go hAcaill. Sa deireadh thiar thall ar an Luan 20 Meán Fómhair tógadh na cónair thalamh Acla, deich garr a n-íompar. Cuireadh in uaigh mhór amháin i reilig Chill Dhamhnaít ar an taobh ó dheas den oileán iad.

**Solemn Requiem Mass** was said at 10.30am on Saturday 18th September, in Holy Family & St Ninian's Church, Kirkintilloch. It had originally been intended to bury the victims in the Old Aisle Cemetery, Kirkintilloch, but this plan was quickly altered when a telegram from Ireland, bearing the words 'Beir Abhaile Ar Marbh' ('Bring Home Our Dead'), reached Kirkintilloch.

After mass, the coffins were dispatched on the long journey to Achill, with relatives of the dead walking behind the hearses as far as the Kirkintilloch boundary. There, special buses were provided to take them to the Broomielaw, Glasgow. There were emotional scenes as the ten coffins were carried on board the Burns & Laird vessel *Lairdsburn* and laid on an upper deck.

After an overnight voyage, the ship reached Dublin and came slowly up the Liffey, watched by an estimated 6,000 people on the quayside. The coffins were then transferred to the three rear coaches of an awaiting train for the overland journey to Achill. Finally, on Monday 20th September, the coffins were transported across Achill Island, each one on the roof of a motor car, and were buried in a mass grave at Kildownet Cemetery, in the south of the island.
